Dear Mr. Carlton:

This letter will confirm our discussions regarding the incident at your waste oil site in Violet Township on June 24th. There are three basic issues at hand.

- Pages 16-18 of the enclosed booklet show the requirements of the release reporting rules of the State of Ohio. It is due within 30 days and a copy also should be sent to this office.
- 2. Under Sara III, your company should have filed within 60 days starting the operation which we understand was about four years ago.

While there are penalties for failure to file for each of the four years, we offer the following:

- a. Make a current filing for the period ending 12/31/94 and make payment to the State of Ohio of \$115.00 which is \$100 plus \$15 late fee.
- b. Make a voluntary contribution of at least \$115 for each full or part year you used the facility. Make that contribution payable to the Fairfield County LEPC and mail it to this office. Your donation will be used to purchase equipment and supplies for the local hazmat team and will be acknowledged with thanks.
- 3. Within 60 days of moving to a different facility you must file an application with a fee of \$100 per the booklet instructions. Since this will be a "new facility there won't be a late payment.

I trust this will be satisfactory to you. If there are any questions, please call us.

RE - SPILL REPORT FOR ELLIS OIL COMPANY (PICKERINGTON, OHIO)

Dear Mr. Bolger:

At approximately 7:00 a.m. on June 24, 1995, it was discovered that the Ellis Oil Company site at 75 North Center Street, Pickerington, Ohio had been vandalized. An ancillary line from a tank leased by Perma-Fix of Dayton, Inc. for the storage of used oil was manipulated by the vandals. Approximately 40 gallons of used oil was leaked from the three (3) inch line. The material was spilled onto the clay and gravel driveway at the site. The Ellis Oil Company had approximately twelve (12) drums of petroleum oil products in 55-gallon drums stored at the site. The contents of approximately four (4) of the Ellis Oil Company drums were dumped on to the ground. The material from the drums was dumped on to a grassy, low area by the Ellis Oil garage/ storage building.

The impact of the spill was limited to contamination of the soil and clay driveway and the area by the garage / storage building. The material did not leave the facility property line and is therefore not a reportable event under 3750.06 of the Ohio Revised Code. This report is submitted for informational purposes following discussions with Dan Bolger of the Fairfield County Emergency Planning Council.

Upon discovery of the vandalism and release of oil, authorities were immediately notified. The Pickerington Police Department investigated the vandalism and attempted arson (Police Report #95-CR-185). The Violet Township Fire Department also investigated the incident and the Ohio EPA was notified. Chris Bonner of the Ohio EPA (Emergency Response Division) reviewed the site.

The Fee Corportation was immediately notified for management of the spilled material. A response team consisting of Perma-Fix and Fee Corporation employees, removed the spilled liquid material with vacuum tankers and excavated the contaminated soil. All soil contaminated by the release was removed and isolated for transport to an appropriate disposal facility. The contaminated soil has been analyzed by a commercial laboratory (TCLP, TPH, BTEX, PCB) and reviewed by Wes Drake of the Ohio EPA. Mr. Drake has authorized the disposal of the soil at a Subtitle D (Non-Hazardous) land-fill.

Perma-Fix of Dayton has terminated lease of the storage tank at the Ellis Oil Co. facility. No Perma-Fix property or materials remain at the site. Please contact me directly if additional information is needed.
