NARRATIVE

RECEIVED A CALL OF A TRUCK LEAKING FUEL AT THE 700 BLOCK OF S. MAPLE ST, UPON ARRIVAL FOUND A TANDEM AXIL DUMP TRUCK LICENSE # PBT 9919 WITH A LOW BOY TRAILER LICENSE # TLU 1200 LEAKING DIESEL FUEL FROM A FUEL TANK ON THE TRAILER. THE FUEL WAS IDENTIFIED AS DIESEL AND IMMEDIATELY BEGAN TO DIKE THE LEAK WITH ABSORBENT AND PADS. AN ATTEMPT WAS MADE TO OFFLOAD THE FUEL INTO OTHER CONTAINERS, HOWEVER MOST OF THE FUEL HAD LEAKED ON TO THE GROUND. THE OTHER SPILL IN THIS INCIDENT WAS ON THE STREET FROM THE SITE ON MAPLE ST. BACK TO LAKE ST WITH THE INTERSECTIONS BEING THE WORST AREAS. GREEN STUFF ABSORBENT WAS USED AT THE INTERSECTIONS TO ABSORB AS MUCH OF THE FUEL AS POSSIBLE. THE OWNER OF THE TRUCK WAS TAM CONSTRUCTION LOCATED AT 1480 SUGAR GROVE RD. TAM CONSTRUCTION CALLED A PRIVATE CONTRACTOR BBU TO CLEAN THE SPILL UP. BBU ARRIVED AT THE SCENE AROUND 1910 HRS. BBU WAS ADVISED THAT ABOUT 100 GALS OF DIESEL FUEL HAD BEEN SPILLED AND THE LOCATIONS WERE FD ABSORBED THE FUEL. BBU ADVISED THAT THE EPA WOULD BE NOTIFIED AND THEY COULD FINISH CLEANING THE ENTIRE SPILL. MATERIAL USED TO ABSORB THE SPILL WERE 5 GAL OIL DRY, 8 CUBIC FT OF GREEN STUFF ABSORBENT, 20 ABSORBENT PADS, 2 SHOVELS, 2 STREET BROOMS. ENG CO 1 AND STATION TRUCK 1 CLEARED THE SCENE.

RE: Follow-up emergency notice of release of diesel fuel from lowboy trailer onto ground starting in Baltimore, Ohio to Lancaster, Ohio on January 6, 2000.

Dear Mr. Bolger:

The following is our written follow-up to the referenced release incident in response to the required regulations.

1. When
 - a) 5:00 P.M., Jan. 6, 2000 duration of one and one half hour.
 - b) Discovered 100 gallon fuel tank on the trailer was leaking approximately 5:30 P. M. Jan. 6, 2000.
 - c) Vehicle was stopped on a graveled parking area by the Lancaster Police department who contacted the Lancaster Fire department. The fire department began spreading absorbent at the street intersections to contain the diesel fuel. We contacted BBU Services, Inc. of Lancaster to respond and clean the diesel fuel from the streets and parking area. BBU Services arrived at the parking area at approximately 6:45 P. M. and continued spreading oil dry to contain the released diesel fuel. BBU Services also mobilized necessary people and equipment to load and haul away the contaminated soil and gravel from the parking area for disposal.
 - d) OEPA spill number is 0001-23-0093
2. Location

The release occurred while traveling from Baltimore, Ohio along SR 256 and SR 37 through Walnut and Pleasant Townships to the Company yard in Lancaster, Ohio. The release was concentrated in the parking area along Maple Ave. near the junction of Canal Street in Lancaster, Ohio, where the vehicle was stopped.
3. Product Release

10. Chronology

January 6, 2000

5:30 P.M. Received first call from the Lancaster Police Department – the dispatcher asked if the Company owned the truck and trailer involved and if so do we have radio contact. When questioned why, the dispatcher said there was fuel leaking from the vehicle and the Police were trying to stop the vehicle. We told the dispatcher there was no radio in that particular vehicle.

5:45 P.M. We received the second call from the Lancaster Police Department dispatcher - vehicle had been stopped along Maple Avenue – leak was from tank and someone needs to go to the vehicle to help stop the leak – sent a second employee to help with the leak – second employee radioed back the leak was due to a rupture in the seam of the fuel tank on the trailer used to refuel equipment and they would not be able to stop or contain the leak. After talking to the Police and Fire Departments, we were informed a spill cleanup company would have to be on site before they could leave the area.

6:00 P.M. The Company owner was notified of the situation, and BBU Services was called to respond to the spill. By this time the tank had drained on the parking area along Maple Avenue.

6:45 P.M. BBU Services cleanup crew was at the spill area and cleanup of the diesel fuel had begun. BBU Services used oil dry to contain the diesel fuel spilled on the paved streets and also loaded the contaminated soil and gravel on their dump truck for disposal. Vehicle returned to the Company yard.

January 7, 2000

8:00 A.M. We received a reminder call from BBU Services that OEPA needed to be called and a report made of the spill

8:45 A.M. Phoned OEPA to report the incident and have a report number assigned.

10:30 A.M. Phoned OEPA to acquire report number – 0001-23-0093.

11:00 A.M. Phoned BBU Services with report for their records.

11. Documentation

12. Causes

The release was caused by the failure of a welded seam on a 100-gallon fuel tank. The tank was mounted to the tongue of a tandem axle tag trailer being pulled by a dump truck. At some point during the transport from Baltimore to Lancaster, the seam failed allowing diesel fuel to be released to the roadways. The position of the tank made it impossible for the driver to see while traveling. After returning to the Company yard the evening of January 6, the fuel tank was removed from the trailer. At this time we have no plans to reinstall a tank on the trailer.

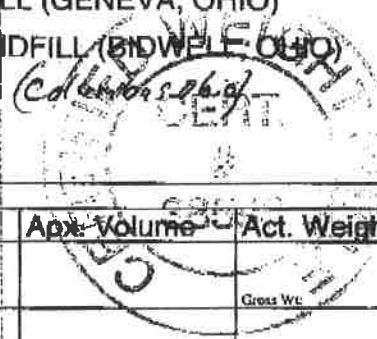
