On March 18, 2004, the Special Ops Team, at the request of Amanda TWP FD, responded to 4650 Winchester-Southern Rd. We were requested due to water well drillers drilling into a gas pocket.

The team was dispatched. Brad Shull, Jeff Shull responded with the SOT truck and Larry Moore responded in his private vehicle. I responded in private vehicle.

Upon arrival at scene checked with Chief Thaxton. He advised that Columbia Gas was on scene and advised that they did not know proper procedure. They advised that Columbia had no lines or storage fields in the area. They provided names of potential companies who could deal with problem. Chief Thaxton requested team to stand-by. Richard Kilbarger was contacted. He is a driller. He advised them to pump water back into well. He stated that the water would force gas back into ground and seal it off. Amanda positioned trucks and pumped the well full of water. It worked.
